Introduction

The Training on "The Main Principles for an Effective Quality Assurance Policy: Experience of UNIVAQ and VUM" held at University of L'Aquila (Italy) from March 10-14 was designed to equip governance, academic and administrative staff of Uzbekistan universities with skills, knowledge and attitudes necessary to implement and continuously enhance a quality assurance system in their institutions. It brought together representatives from all project partners and provided an invaluable platform for knowledge exchange and strengthening international partnerships in the field of education quality assurance..

The training content is adopted in accordance with information received during the analysis on managerial, administrative, and educational gaps. Led by esteemed professors and experts from UNIVAQ and VUM, the sessions combined theoretical and hands-on sessions, equipping participants with essential strategies for ensuring quality in higher education. Uzbekistan partners have access to the training materials after the training on the project website and Google Drive which is using by partners as a tool to share all working and completed project documents.

The training materials will be used for the multiplication trainings at institutional level by trained staff in their universities involving all academic and corresponding administrative departments. Uzbek partners also plan to held an open QA workshop with involvement of Ministry of Higher Education and other external stakeholders.

The training also plays essential role for the effective implementation of the WP4 - Developing Strategic, Operative and Supporting Processes for enhancement of Quality Assurance systems at Uzbekistan universities. During the training the partners discussed and fulfilled on-hand exercises to develop the concepts and structure of quality assurance system for "new university" concept of which were also elaborated during practical sessions of the training.

Detailed insights into the training content, outcomes, and methodologies are documented in the **D3.2 Training Report**. This report provides a comprehensive overview of the program and its impact.

To further support dissemination and sustainability, a complete set of training materials, including resources for multiplication training, has been prepared. These materials are intended to empower trainers to conduct the internal trainings, ensuring broader reach and impact.
